- 1 EPIC_WK 16_Catholic Reformation II (1700 1913)
- 2 <u>Council of Trent:</u> (Most productive in history) Called to bring about *authentic reform* of the Church in
- 3 response to Protestant Revolution; focus on Doctrine, Devotion, Discipline
- 4 THIRD MEETING Sessions 17-25, (1562-1563, Pius IV (St Charles Borromeo,), Additional teachings on
- 5 Eucharist (Communion under both species and Communion of little children), definition of Holy Orders,
- 6 Matrimony, defined Purgatory, Veneration of saints, relics, sacred art, indulgences, Called for revision
- 7 and publication of Roman Missal, Divine Office, Authorized formation of a universal Catechism,
- 8 Required bishops to reside at least nine months of year in diocese (if absent more than 6
- 9 months=deposed), Called for <u>creation of seminaries</u>, Priest to reside in parish/wear clerical garb.
- 10 **Pope Pius V** (Father of Catholic Reformation, Dominican order, devoted to Blessed Mother and Rosary):
- 11 Reform without action is not effective; provides solid, universal leadership through Jesuits*/others to
- 12 enforce decrees of the Council; revised/reformed Liturgy (Tridentine Mass) and other rites
- 13 *Society of Jesus (Jesuits, founded by St Ignatius of Loyola¹): wrote Spiritual Exercise² (faithful method
- 14 for advancing holiness using self-control, self-discipline to imitate life of Christ);1. Wanted to participate
- in authentic reform of Church, 2. Wanted to fight heresy (especially in Germany and England)-St Francis
- 16 Xavier (Far EAST-Japan, China); Jesuits like *special ops* troops of 16th and 17th century
- 17 <u>ISLAM</u> (latter part of 16th century: New form of Islam-*Ottoman Turks*; build large fleets, goal is to attack
- 18 Rome (red apple); still goal in 21st century (2008, Hamas leader, Very soon, Allah willing, Rome will be
- 19 conquered just like Constantinople...then into all of Europe...then to two Americas
- 20 Pope Pius V: saw the Turkish threat growing; forms Holy League-alliance between Papal States, Venice
- 21 and Kingdom of Spain; constructs fleet to attack Turkish fleet; Don Juan of Austria is leader (24 yrs. old,
- 22 illegitimate son of Holy Roman Emperor Charles V
- 23 Battle in Gulf of Lepanto (1571): Islam 300 War galleys, 100,000+ men, 14,000 Christian galley slaves;
- 24 *Christians*-200 ships, all warriors given a *ROSARY* before fleet sailed; all ships were blessed by papal
- 25 representative, chaplains throughout fleet (Dominicans, Franciscans, Jesuits), (Miguel Cervantes-was
- 26 injured in battle, wrote novel, *Don Quixote*). Islam fleet aligned in form of a *crescent*; Christians align in
- form of a cross; Christian SECRET WEAPONS: Don Juan had side mounted cannons instead of forward
- 28 mounted cannons, had musketeers on top of deck, Christian SPIRITUAL WEAPON: picture of Our Lady of
- 29 Guadalupe reproduction on flagship of fleet. OUTCOME: Sunday, Oct 7, 1571

- 30 Pope Pius V: Celebrated then ordered commemoration every year under title Our Lady of Victory, later
- 31 Pope Gregory XIII changed to *Our Lady of the Rosary*; Battle turning point of Islamic conquest in
- 32 Mediterranean
- 33 Holy Saints: Three categories: 1. Mystics: St Theresa of Avila (reformed Carmelites, Doctor of the
- Church), St John of the Cross (wrote *Dark Night of the Soul*, Doctor of the Church), **2. Missionaries**, St
- 35 Charles Borromeo, (Archbishop of Milan), St John Neri (Congregation of the Oratory, reformers of soul
- 36 through imitation of Christ), St Frances DeSales (Bishop of Geneva-combats Calvinism, wrote
- 37 Introduction to the Devout Life), St Peter Canisius, writes German catechism, second apostle to
- 38 Germany-St Boniface was the first apostle to Germany), St Ignatius of Loyola (Founder of Jesuit Order,
- 39 missionary to Far East, printed catechism in Japanese) Martyrs
- 40 <u>New World Evangelization</u>: Spanish, establish colony in Florida area (St Augustine), Southwest US, South
- 41 America, (1565), Mexico
- 42 <u>Our Lady of Guadalupe</u>: Aztec Indians converted after appearance to Juan Diego
- 43 <u>Church and Slavery:</u> MYTH: Church never spoke out against slavery: (1537) Pope Paul III issues decree
- 44 that slavery is inadmissible; Bartolomé de Las Casas (Spanish priest, landowner, lawyer, defender of
- 45 Native Americans rights; St Peter Claver (1610), (priest, missionary, defender of African slaves); Pope
- 46 Urban VIII decrees (1639) prohibited capture, and removal of Africans from their native country by
- 47 Catholic.
- 48 Martyrs in New World: Blessed Marie of the Incarnation, Ursuline nun sent to New France, crucial to
- spread of Catholicism, founded first girl's school in New World, speaks Iroquois, Algonquin and Huron, 12/10/22 ascensionpress.com

- 50 writes catechism in native languages; St Isaac Jogues, travels throughout upstate New York, named Lake
- 51 George as Lake of Blessed Sacrament, martyred and killed by Mohawk tribe; St John, learned native
- language, writes catechism, captured and martyred by Mohawk
- 53 Blessed Kateri *Lily of Mohawks*: 10 yrs. after Mohawk tribe killed St Isaac and St John, give great witness
- to her fellow tribe of her life in Christ and belief in God, dies young at 24 years old
- 55 <u>Galileo Affair (1633):</u> Dramatic advances in Mathematics, physics, chemistry, physiology, geometry and
- astronomy; World moves away from <u>Age of Faith</u> to <u>Age of Reason</u> (science); men will no longer look up
- 57 to God but *look inward* to himself, a <u>man-centered</u> society; Church had understanding of the nature of
- 58 truth/reality, Galileo had a different opinion-what explains TRUTH, reality or faith? What is reality?
- 59 **CHURCH:** Faith/science give understanding/truth of **metaphysical** (Nature of the mind) **questions**
- Why do we exist? Why are we here? What's the purpose of my life? What am I to do? <u>Faith/Science are</u>
- 61 *compatible*
- 62 **GALILEO**: Only physical science can demonstrate understanding of what is truth by explaining reality;
- science is greater than faith; science can answer the questions with observation and reason -all other
- 64 explanations are wrong. (Galileo schooled as mathematician and scientist but tries to answer
- 65 philosophical questions without proper knowledge of the subjects
- 66 Nicholas Copernicus (1545): Proposes new theory of understanding the world (Heliocentric Theory)-sun
- is center of our universe Earth and planets revolve around the sun (as opposed to Ptolemaic
- Aristotelian view Sun and planets revolve around the Earth); **PROBLEM:** Heliocentric Theory not
- 69 scientifically proven until 19th century yet, Galileo accepts; Church states Heliocentric Theory contrary to
- 70 Scripture (Book of Joshua); Church cautious because of Protestant Revolution accusation that Church
- 71 contradicts Scripture; Galileo teaches Heliocentric Theory as TRUTH; Church told him could not teach
- 72 but continue private research, writes *Dialogue Concerning Two Chief World Systems* (1632, satirical
- work, 1000 copies made) used as means to promote Heliocentric Theory without actually teaching it;
- Pope Urban was a friend of Galileo who did not see Copernicium as heresy but noted his caricature in
- book; at 70 years old, Galileo brought before Inquisition much later, brought again before inquisition;
- 76 DECISION: Galileo censored for *suspected* heresy, forbidden from teaching Copernican system, given 3
- yrs. *house arrest*; book on list of banned works a very light sentence; penance was to recite the seven
- 78 Psalms per day for 3 yrs.; died at age 77 Conviction more about disobedience; 1992, Pope John Paul
- 79 convenes commission to study-CONCLUSION: the judgment of the Inquisition was understandable for
- 80 the age but was a subjective error of judgment (pastorally imprudent judgment-Church and Galileo
- 81 involved in discussion neither knew much about
 - **EASTERN EUROPE** (Sept 11, 1683): Turks at gates of Vienna; Polish King Leon Sobieski recues them; end to Muslim threat to Europe

¹ St Ignatius of Loyola: Founder of Jesuits; injured in battle; spent time reading life of Christ/lives of saints; felt guilt; saw Mary in vision, made pilgrimage to Montserrat (Barcelona), stayed 1 yr. w/religious order, as pauper, in cave praying; had trial of scruples; peace of mind returned; began writing the Spiritual Exercises². Went to Holy Land, spent 11 yrs. in various universities; jailed twice for orthodoxy; together with St Francis Xavier/4 others vowed to serve the Pope and Pope Paul III approved the Society of Jesus. Ignatius first general, worked with orphans, catechumens, penitents; found Roman College; was true mystic; based his spiritual life on the Trinity, Christ, and the Eucharist; motto "for the greater glory of God." All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls. Reflection: Luther nailed his theses to the church door at Wittenberg in 1517. Seventeen years later, Ignatius of Loyola founded the Society that was to play so prominent a part in the Catholic Reformation. He was an implacable foe of Protestantism. Yet the seeds of ecumenism may be found in his words: "Great care must be taken to show forth orthodox truth in sch a way that if any heretics happen to be present, they may have an example of charity and Christian moderation". No hard words should be used nor any sort of contempt for their errors be shown." One of the greatest ecumenists was the 20th-century German Jesuit, Cardinal Augustin Bea.
